HOME STRETCH OF LEGISLATIVE SESSION

- Friday, February 23 deadline for bills to be passed out of their opposite chamber policy committee
- Monday, February 26 deadline for bills to be passed out of their opposite chamber fiscal committee
- Friday, March 2 deadline for bills to be passed out of their opposite chamber
- Thursday, March 8 Sine Die, the last day of the legislative session

HB 1570 (MACRI)

- Bill Status: Scheduled for executive session in the Senate Human Services and Corrections Committee on 2.23.18
- Bill Summary: Makes the \$30 portion of Homeless Housing and Assistance Surcharge scheduled to sunset in 2023 permanent, addresses the 45% mandate, increases the Homeless Housing and Assistance Surcharge by up to \$50 via a county councilmanic vote.

HB 2578 (RICCELLI) AND SB 5407 (FROCKT)

Bill Status:

- HB 2578 in the Senate Rules Committee
- SB 5407 referred to the House Judiciary Committee

Bill Summary:

 Bans the practice of source of income discrimination, creates a landlord mitigation fund, increases 2060 document recording fee by \$3. The state's share of increase (40%) funds landlord mitigation fund, and remaining 60% of the \$3 increase will raise additional 2060 revenue for every county.

HB 2667 (MACRI) AND SB 6502 (DHINGRA)

Bill Status:

- HB 2667 scheduled for an executive session in the Senate Human Services and Corrections Committee on 2.23.18
- SB 6502 dies in Ways and Means Committee

Bill Summary:

- Improves housing stability for seniors and people with disabilities by making changes to the Housing and Essential Needs and Aged, Blind, or Disabled programs.

HB 1831 (PETTIGREW)

Bill Status:

Referred to the Senate Ways and Means Committee on 2/22/18

Bill Summary:

 Increases stability for people using public assistance by updating asset limits. Bill proposes to increase cash asset limit from \$1,000 to \$6,000. and it increases the vehicle asset limit from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

HB 1239 (SULLIVAN)

Bill Status:

In Senate Rules Committee

Bill Summary:

 Provides free access to medical records needed to appeal federal Supplemental Security Income or Social Security Disability Insurance denials.

HB 2437 (ROBINSON)

Bill Status:

In the House Rules Committee; bill is related to revenue and is exempt from regular cutoff dates.

Bill Summary:

 Allows local governments to redirect a portion of the sales tax to invest in affordable homes. If utilized by each county, it would generate \$500 million resulting in over 14,000 new safe, healthy and affordable homes.

HB 2444 (SLATTER)

Bill Status:

Referred to the Senate Ways and Means Committee

Bill Summary:

This bill provides a very important technical clarification that the state is not to tax affordable housing that is funded with federal low income housing tax credits when the for-profit investor exits the ownership after they've received their tax credits.

HB 2382 (RYU)

Bill Status:

 Scheduled for an executive session in the Senate Human Services and Corrections Committee on 2.23.18.

Bill Summary:

Promotes the use of surplus public property for affordable housing.
