Renter Facts for Legislative District 17

This fact sheet contains information collated from the U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey 2022 data. This is the most recent ACS data available.

Key Facts:

- Renters are approximately 26% or 39,727 of the 155,360 people housed in LD 17.
- Approximately 49% of renter households in LD 17 pay more than 30% of their income in rent.
 HUD defines these households as cost burdened. That's approximately 6,971 renter households.
- Median monthly rent in LD 17 is \$1,689 or \$20,268 annually.
 - The first 7% annual increase in rent will be \$118.
 - The second annual 7% increase will be \$127.
 - The third annual 7% increase will be \$135.
 - o Rent will have increased \$380 amount over just 3 years to a total of \$2,069 a month.
 - Total annual rent for the household will be \$24,829.

Seniors in LD 17:

- The median annual income for those age 65+ in LD 17 is \$74,450. The median senior in LD 17 pays 27% of their annual income on rent. 27% of LD 17 seniors are cost burdened.

Highlights:

- Statewide, 57% of Black, non-Hispanic households are cost burdened compared to 46% of White, non-Hispanic households.
- Statewide, 30% of multiracial households pay more than 50% of their income on housing costs compared to 24% of White, non-Hispanic households.
