

Renter Facts for Legislative District 5

This fact sheet contains information collated from the U.S. Census Bureau’s American Community Survey 2022 data.¹ This is the most recent ACS data available.

Key Facts:

- Renters are approximately 19% or 29,647 of the 155,787 people housed in LD 5.
- Approximately 42% of renter households in LD 5 pay more than 30% of their income in rent. HUD defines these households as cost burdened. That’s approximately 4,861 renter households.
- Median monthly rent in LD 5 is \$2,376 or \$28,512 annually.
 - o The first 7% annual increase in rent will be \$166.
 - o The second annual 7% increase will be \$178.
 - o The third annual 7% increase will be \$190.
 - o Rent will have increased \$535 amount over just 3 years to a total of \$2,911 a month.
 - o Total annual rent for the household will be \$34,928.

Seniors in LD 5:

- The median annual income for those age 65+ in LD 5 is \$83,076. The median senior in LD 5 pays 34% of their annual income on rent. 34% of LD 5 seniors are cost burdened.

Highlights:

- Statewide, 57% of Black, non-Hispanic households are cost burdened compared to 46% of White, non-Hispanic households.
- Statewide, 30% of multiracial households pay more than 50% of their income on housing costs compared to 24% of White, non-Hispanic households.
