What is Coordination of Care?

Even if you've never heard the term "**care coordination**," you've likely noticed when it was done well. Just as likely, you have noticed when it wasn't done well.

Why Is COC Important In Housing?

When it's done well, care coordination not only improves the participants' experience, it also can improve outcomes.



Characteristics of Care Coordination

- Collaboration between all members of a care team, no matter their specialty, role or location
- Clear communication between all parties involved in a participant's care, including the participant/ participant's caregiver
- Assessing all of a participants needs not just their immediate housing needs

So...what is the Golden Thread? And why is it important?

- Refers to a connection between:
 - Assessment tools used
 - Individualized service/treatment plan (ISP)
 - Interventions provided
 - Progress notes
- Medicaid requires it
- Can lead to provision of more effective services

- Supported Employment Services
- Substance Use Disorder Services (SUD)
- Supportive Housing Services
- Primary Care Physician
- Mental Health Services
- Additional Resources (SOAR, SNAP, TANF, DCS, Etc)





Case Note Scenerio

- D Met with Jon at the local Housing Authority, he appeared to be in a good mood, was well groomed and had completed his housing application.
- I/A Jon and I met with his HUD Case Manager regarding his Section 8 voucher and the rules and requirements behind his housing subsidy. "This is really exciting, I've been waiting a long time for this and I can't wait to get into my own place and out of the shelter." Jon and I began looking for places that he felt would meet his needs, immediately.
- P- Jon will continue searching for housing and will call with any leads. Jon will reach out to DSHS to try to get a copy of his ID to complete his HUD application. We will meet at our normal time next week, unless a housing opportunity comes up.
