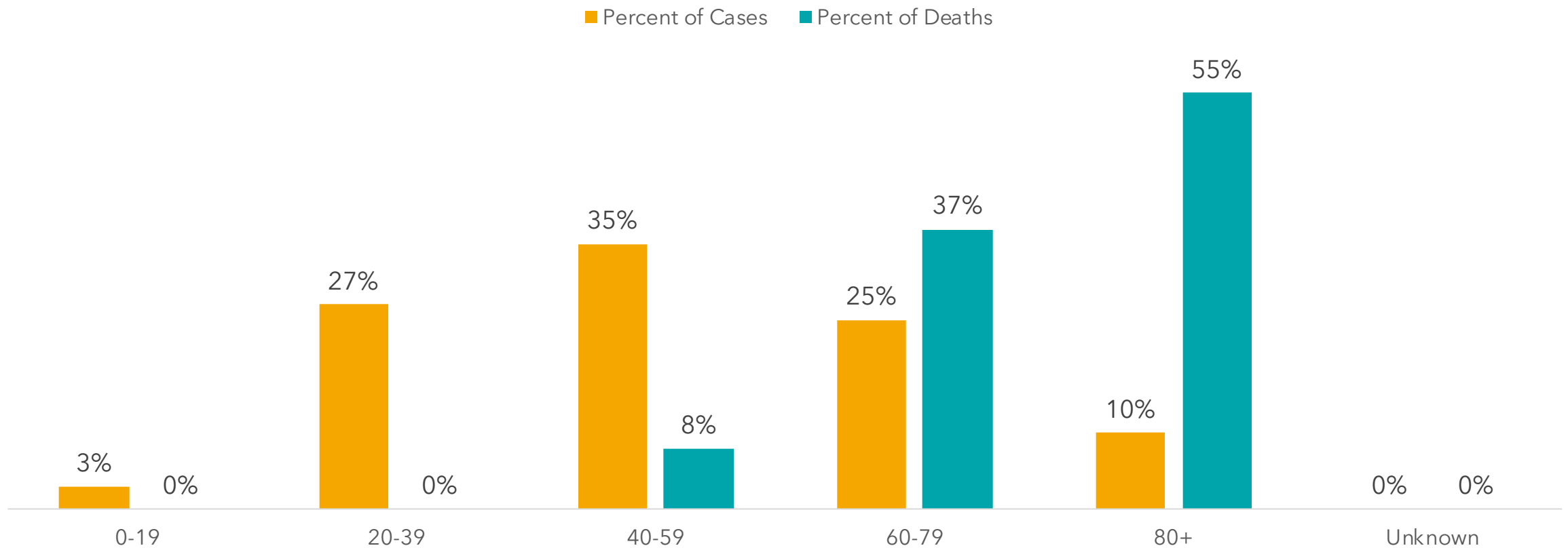

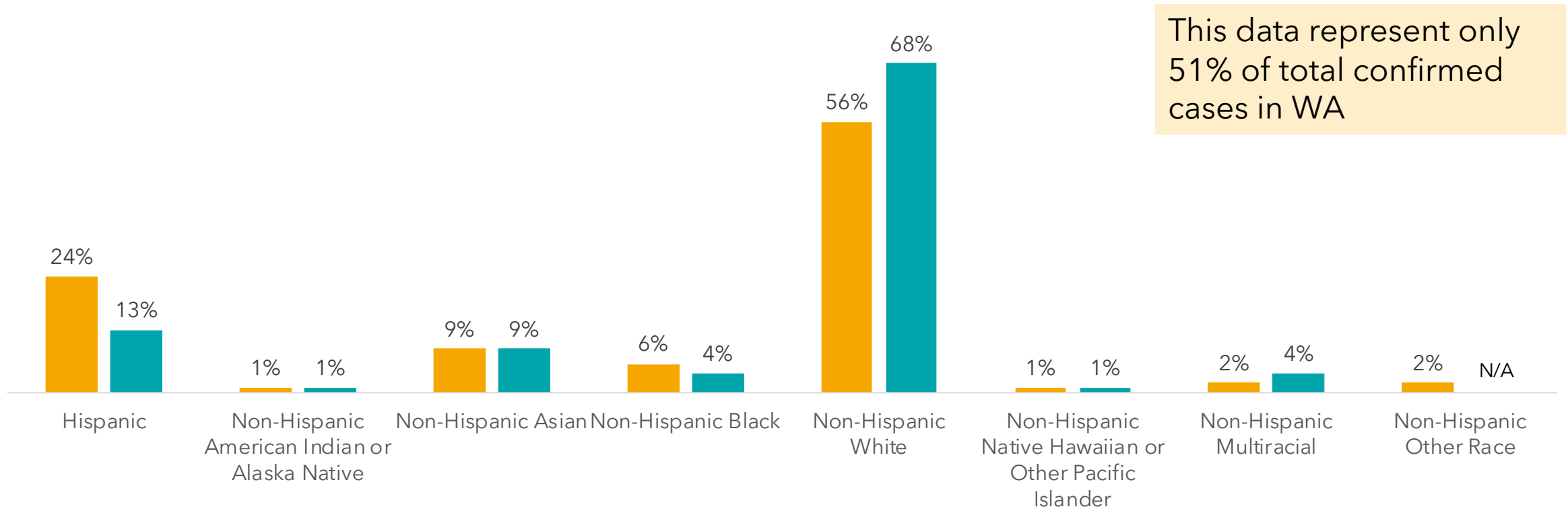
Confirmed Cases /Deaths by Age

■ Percent of Cases* ■ Percent of Total WA Population

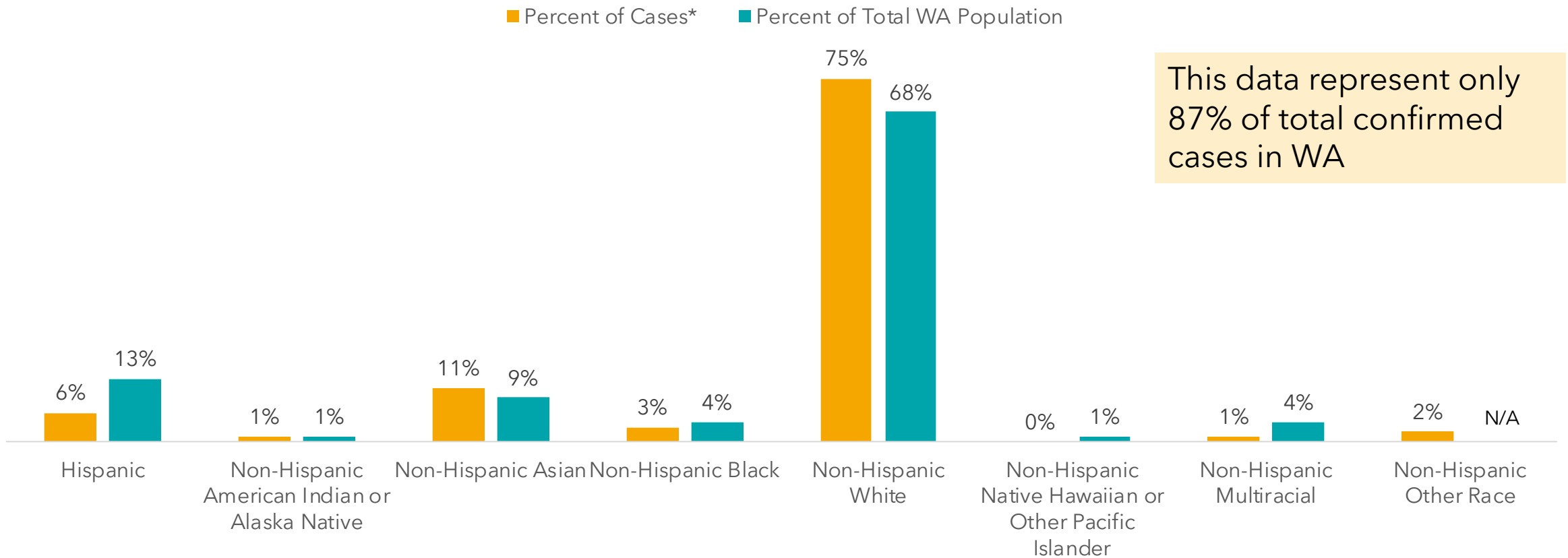

Caveats and Challenges



Caveats to Data

- Small sample sizes
- Lack of widespread testing
- Not representative of general population

Challenges to getting accurate and comprehensive data disaggregated by race and ethnicity

- Being refused testing and care;
- Unavailability of testing and care nearby;
- Lack of childcare;
- Work schedules and the need for employment make it impossible to take time off;
- Fear of contracting the virus; and
- Lack of medical insurance and fear of high medical costs.
